

The regular meeting of the Beverly Town Council was held Monday, January 11, 2021, at 6:30 pm in council chambers of Beverly Town Hall. Members and visitors stood for the Pledge of Allegiance and were led in prayer by Mayor Andy Burns. Mayor Burns called the meeting to order in the presence of recorder Barbara Smith, members Robbie Moyer, Matt Lewis and Becky Weese. Katie Whittaker and Debbie Stalnaker were absent. Visitors included Robin Wilson, A.G. Vanscoy and Kenny Weese. Mayor Burns called the meeting to order and asked that the record show there were three council members present, a quorum necessary to make proceeding with the meeting legal.

With all members having received copies of the minutes, Mr. Moyer made a motion to forego the oral reading of the December 14, 2020 minutes and to accept the minutes as submitted. Motion seconded by Mr. Lewis with all in favor.

Karl Mulac who was on the agenda was not present.

POLICE VEHICLE - EQUIPMENT

Mayor Burns announced that the police vehicle is lettered, with tires, oil change completed. The lights have been installed and other maintenance done, with exception of a few little things the vehicle is ready. Chief Vanscoy commented that it's running fine.

OFFICE RENOVATIONS – WINDOW

The new security door has been installed in the office. There is still a problem with getting a quote on the window with the drawer but a cheaper way is found to do it and hope that it will be installed soon. Prison Industries are in the process of making a desk for the Police Chief.

Members were reminded that the Town Election is May 3, 2021 with the filing period being January 11-30.

POLICE EQUIPMENT

Chief Vanscoy has worked for two weeks compiling everything needed to equip the cruiser. He is familiar with what is needed in the line of computer and equipment. Chief Vanscoy went over price of items needed before he could operate. Following are prices of items needed: \$5629.20 from Biser's Radio for radios and antennas, etc. From IN-SYNCH \$2995.00 for software and services. (yearly cost of \$595.00 for system that is used by law enforcement to Charleston). From MPH Industries \$1308.98 for radar gun and accessories. MITEC computer software \$1320.10. From Markl Supply Co firearms and ammunition \$2202.87.

A motion was made by Mr. Lewis to approve and pay the invoices submitted in the above amounts for necessary police equipment requested by Chief Vanscoy. Motion seconded by Mrs. Weese with all in favor.
