

The regular meeting of the Beverly Town Council was held Monday, November 8, 2021, at 6:30 pm in council chambers of Beverly Town Hall. Mayor Burns called the meeting to order in the presence of recorder Connie Pingley, members Matt Lewis, Beck Weese, and Robbie Moyer. Visitors present: Town Clerk Robin Wilson, the Chief of Police Allan Vanscoy, and Chris Mielke from the Beverly Heritage Center. Mayor Burns led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance and prayer.

With all members having received copies of the minutes, Robbie Moyer made a motion to forego the oral reading of the October 11, 2021 minutes and to accept the minutes as submitted. Motion seconded by Matt Lewis. All in favor.

OLD BUSINESS

Discussion about the No Parking Ordinance on Court Street. After the discussion of the parking ordinance, it was decided that the ordinance has been in effect since 2017 and no changes are to be made.

A short discussion was held on the Pike St. traffic flow. Residents were mailed a letter on the One-Way proposal and most were in favor of this. A

motion was made by Robbi Moyer to make traffic going one way East on Pike Street, Becky Weese seconded the motion. All in favor.

The mayor signed a Proclamation claiming Christian Heritage Week to be November 21 – 27, 2021.

Short discussion on Christmas Tree purchase for the Town Square, Robbi Moyer made a motion to make a \$200.00 limit on the tree purchase, Becky Weese seconded. All in favor. Would like to decorate the tree before Thanksgiving week. It was suggested to ask some area children to help with the decorating.

Police Chief Vanscoy asked the council to purchase cell phone and a camera for official use. The state has group plans through AT&T for \$35.00. Matt Lewis made a motion and Robbie Moyer seconded. All in favor. Chief Vanscoy stated the town people misunderstood the process of how citations were issued.

21 miles over speed limit.


The officer wrote 3.1 citations an hour.
