This leak occurred early in the morning, fast response of the two departments were able to quickly find and shut off the leak. Both sewer and water department had this leak fixed before noon and samples were dropped off to Clarksburg water board at 12:41pm, boil water advisory was issued for kings run, sugar creek, scoot's lake, and upper files creek.

13. Results we received Friday morning and boil water advisory was lifted
