

The regular meeting of the Beverly Town Council was held Monday, August 08, 2022, at 6:30 pm in council chambers of Beverly Town Hall. Mayor Burns called the meeting to order in the presence of Council members Matt Lewis, Becky Weese, Debbie Stalnaker, Katie Whittaker, and Robbie Moyer. Connie Pingley was absent. Police Chief AG Vanscoy and Town Clerk Robin Wilson. Visitors present: Chris Mielke with BHC and town resident Vickie Dewitt.

Minutes

Motion made by Becky Weese to approve minutes without reading aloud, seconded by Matt Lewis. All in Favor.

Visitors

Chris Mielke with the Beverly Heritage Center stated future reports will be done quarterly versus monthly. Heritage Days had a similar turnout as in 2019 with close to 180 people attending. The town was considered a sponsor and the logo was displayed. They are seeking feedback on upcoming projects and exhibits so please spread the word. Lantern Tours will be on Oct. 14-15 and Oct. 21-22. The Landmarks Commission will start placing the new walking tour signs soon. The center is looking to fill the position of Marketing Director.

Vickie Dewitt was upset that she was cited for violation of Ordinance 12, Dog At Large. She admitted her dog wanders Livingston Ave. at her house. Stated there are other problems in town and would appreciate if the officer would leave her alone. She paid the ticket but doesn't want anymore.

Old Business

Debbie Stalnaker motioned to grant 4 business licenses and 1 contractor registration. Katie Whittaker seconded. All in favor.

New Business

Valley Business System – Yearly contract renewal for the copier is due 08/30/2022. Clerk Robin Wilson presented a proposal from Hart Office Solutions with 2 options. They only service Toshiba, not Sharp models,

which is the copier purchased through VBS. The matter was tabled until the next meeting to try and get other quotes from other companies, if possible.

Snow Plow - The snow plow belongs to the town and believed to have been used only one winter. It does not fit any vehicle the town has and since the pole building needs finished, the plow could be sold to recoup some of the cost of pouring the rest of the concrete. Katie Whittaker motioned to sell the snow plow with Becky Weese seconding. All in favor.

Chief of Police Report

AG reported there were 28 citations issued in July. He would like to get body camera(s) for the officer(s) for their protection. The camera is around \$500, can record for 8-12 hours with night vision. Still have the goal of hiring a second officer. Becky Weese motioned to purchase 2 body cameras. Debbie Stalnaker seconded. All in favor.

The vehicle grant is still a work in progress. With the 55% grant, once a vehicle is specified, if it's not available the process has to start all over.

Financial Reviews & Approval of Vendor Invoices

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted as presented.

Becky Weese made a motion to pay the invoices printed and reviewed, seconded by Matt Lewis. All in favor.


Updates and information


There were no Water and Sewer Board Meeting minutes or Plant Operators Reports for review.
