TOWN OF BEVERLY

A RESOLUTION OF BEVERLY TOWN COUNCIL ADOPTING THE REGION VII PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN, UPDATED 2023.

WHEREAS the Council recognizes the threat that natural hazards pose to people and property within Randolph County; and

WHEREAS the county has prepared a multi-hazard mitigation plan, hereby known as the Region VII PDC Hazard Mitigation Plan, updated 2023, in accordance with federal laws, including the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Act, as amended; the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended; and the National Dam Safety Program Act, as amended; and

WHEREAS the mitigation plan identifies mitigation goals and actions to reduce or eliminate longterm risk to people and property in the county from the impacts of future hazards and disasters; and

WHEREAS adoption by the Town Council demonstrates its commitment to hazard mitigation and achieving the goals outlined in the Region VII PDC Mitigation Plan, updated 2023.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Town of Beverly, Beverly, WV formally adopts the Region VII Planning and Development Council Hazard Mitigation Plan, updated 2023. While the content related to the town may require revisions to meet the plan approval requirements, changes occurring after adoption will not require the Council to re-adopt any further iterations of the plan. Subsequent plan updates following the approval period for this plan will require separate adoption resolutions.
